Having that important talk

Towards the end of term Year 10 students did an RSE (respect and sexuality education) update and were again

introduced to the Core of Life workshop to discuss relationships, unplanned pregnancy, contraception and consent.

These are conversations that we can't just leave until the middle teenage years. Dr Justin Coulson has online resources and advice to assist parents. He recommends to start early, for example, with babies and toddlers:

. ☐ Start small - use correct terms for the body at bath time/when getting dressed

Practise saying words you may find uncomfortable until they are just comfortable (vagina, penis, vulva)

As they get older, you can:

Model respect for personal space

Teach body boundaries

🙋 Encourage questions and open communication

Help them identify trusted adults

Conversations teenage years:

♀ Parents get excited to talk with them - it's a privilege! Teens it is great that parents are talking with you too!

Choose your time wisely

Get a clear picture of current understanding of consent

Establish what true consent actually is

Invite them into the conversation.

This week is Respect Week and students in Years 7 & 8 listened to Chanel Contos talk about Affirmative Consent. The laws around sexual consent have changed in Victoria and there is new curriculum for the mandatory teaching of affirmative consent in Victorian Schools. There are many resources for students and parents around safety and sexual health in the Health Hub and on reputable websites online.
