2024 SCHOOL COUNCIL ELECTIONS

Every year at this time, School Council membership comes up for nomination and, if necessary, election/re-election. This year we are seeking two parent members to re-nominate or join our School Council. We thank Brett Thompson (our School Council President), Donna Egan, Stuart Nicholls (Vice President), Georgina Morrison (Treasurer) and Mel Waters for their time on our council and we are keen to have their continued guidance during our school review year. As we have two parent vacancies to fill, we are hoping that Brett Thompson again re-nominates for another two-year term, especially in this year of review and reflection for our school, and another parent will nominate to fill our vacancy position. We are also hoping that Claire Ison will again re-nominate as our DE representative (Catherine Grant will continue as our Minute Secretary) and also Savannah Nicholls as a student representative. Keely Allan will continue her two-year term as a Student Member of our council and I will act as Executive Officer. Whitney Jones continues in her two-year term in the Community Member Category (Whitney was co-opted last year). If there are more nominations than positions, there will be a requirement to have an election. Council is an important body of the school organisation and is responsible for the operations of the school. INFORMATION FOR PARENTS

What is a school council and what does it do? All government schools in Victoria have a school council. They are legally formed bodies that are given powers to set the key directions of a school within centrally provided guidelines. In doing this, a school council is able to directly influence the quality of education that the school provides for its students.

Who is on the school council? There are three possible categories of membership:

A mandated elected Parent category. More than one third of the total members must be from this category. Department
of Education and Early Childhood Development (DET) employees can be Parent members at their child's school as long as
they are not employed at the school.

A mandated elected DET employee category. Members of this category may make up no more than one third of the

total membership of school council. The principal of the school is automatically one of these members.

 An optional Community member category. Its members are appointed by a decision of the council because of their special skills, interests or experiences. DET employees are not eligible to be Community members.
 The term of office for all members is two years. Half the members must retire each year, creating vacancies for the annual

school council elections.

Why is Parent membership so important? Parents on school councils provide important viewpoints and have valuable skills that can help shape the direction of the school. Those parents who become active on a school council find their involvement satisfying in itself and may also find that their children feel a greater sense of belonging.

How can you become involved? The most obvious way is to vote in the elections, which are held in Term 1 each year. However, ballots are only held if more people nominate as candidates than there are positions vacant.

In view of this, you might seriously consider:

- standing for election as a member of the school council
- encouraging another person to stand for election.

Do I need special experience to be on school council? No. What you do need is an interest in your child's school and the

desire to work in partnership with others to help shape the school's future.

What do you need to do to stand for election? The principal will issue a notice and call for nominations following the commencement of Term 1 each year. All school council elections must be completed by the end of March. If you decide to stand for election, you can arrange for someone to nominate you as a candidate or you can nominate yourself in the Parent category. DET employees whose child is enrolled in a school in which they are not employed are eligible to nominate as parents for the school council where their child is enrolled. Once the nomination form is completed, return it to the principal within the time stated on the notice of election. You will receive a Nomination Form Receipt in the mail following the receipt of your completed nomination. If there are more nominations received than there are vacancies on council, a ballot will be conducted during the two weeks after the call for nominations has closed.

Remember

- Ask at the school for help if you would like to stand for election and are not sure what to do
 - Consider standing for election to council this year
- Be sure to vote in the elections (if there is one that occurs at our school that is, if the number of nominations outnumbers the number of vacancies).

Code Red Day -

Fire Warning & Emergency Management & Emergency Communication

We are a Category 4 School (rating in Emergency Management) which will mean that on a CODE RED DAY our school will be closed. No buses will run. Generally, we will know a couple of days in advance if this is likely to occur, but it will be determined usually by 1pm the day before. No one is to be on-site if that occurs. Even on EXTREME WEATHER DAYS we still need to be very alert as to what is happening. If a CODE RED DAY is declared we may need to get students out quickly if they are on camp, or, we many need to cancel, or even, keep students there an extra day (if they are supposed to be travelling out that day). Of course, EXCURSIONS will not take place on a CODE RED DAY and even on an EXTREME WEATHER DAY, we may decide to cancel an excursion. Our climate is changing and becoming hotter, and the wind can be very gusty. Notices will also be sent out via XUNO and hopefully there will be enough warning that we can tell students during the day. If this occurs on a weekend, no-one will be allowed on school grounds and the gym will be CLOSED. In the case of any EMERGENCY the school will communicate with parents via XUNO messages.

Arriving Late & Leaving Early

Students who arrive late to school or plan on leaving early MUST have a signed note in their diary or a XUNO absence notification, and must sign in or out using the 'Sign In & Sign Out' book located in the office.

- Parents/guardians of Year 7 and Year 10 students should look out for the vaccine consent
- forms coming home from school with your child. You need to read the information,
- complete and return the form regardless of whether your child is being vaccinated at school.
- The Buloke Shire Council immunisation service may contact you about the Secondary
- School Vaccine Program. Schools are authorised to provide basic parent/guardian contact details to local
- councils for this purpose. Contact the school by 28 February each year if you do not want your contact details given to the Buloke Shire Council immunisation service.




Nerra - The Broken Rainbow



Welcome to Term 1

The start of term has been busy with Year 12 students settling in, new Preps and other new students welcomed to the school. Our swimming program

and swimming sports were a reminder to be sun-smart by wearing rash vests and hats to avoid sunburn. Even mild sunburn can lead to developing melanoma (skin cancer) which is the third most diagnosed cancer in Australia. The 'slip, slop, slap' campaign adds 'seek' for seeking shade and 'slide' on sunglasses to the list of things you can do to protect yourself from sun damage to skin and eyes.

Terms 1 & 4 are always 'hat terms' here at Wycheproof P-12 but we all need to be aware that even on sunny days in winter there is the risk of sunburn.

Safer online

Last week we focused on being safe online and displayed posters and discussed in classrooms and at assembly the importance of internet safety. Information shared included contact details for the Office of the eSafety Commissioner www.esafety.gov.au which has lots of information for primary school age, teens and for parents. During Safer Internet Day, February 6, we were encouraged to take three simple actions to ensure online safety:

- Connect safely by keeping apps and devices secure and reviewing your privacy settings regularly.
- Reflect on how our actions online may affect others or your safety.
- Protect ourselves yourself and others by visiting eSafety.gov.au to find out how to stay safe online and report online abuse.

There was also advice to parents to support their children on line by joining in with games, just as you would with kick-to-kick in the backyard. Health support plans

This week we will send out health support plans for those students who have a diagnosis of asthma, anaphylaxis or any other health concern. This month Wycheproof P-12 staff are also working through anaphylaxis and asthma training modules which is an important endeavour to support the health of students.

We are still on alert for thunderstorm asthma warnings and monitoring the pollen apps. We all need to be aware of asthma first aid: sit upright, **4 puffs of reliever** (one at a time) into the spacer, **4 breaths from the spacer** and **wait 4 minutes to repeat**; if there is no improvement call 000. Health and mental health support at school

The Secondary School Nurse program is available to all secondary students and you don't need a referral. The school nurse is part of the Wellbeing Team to support student health and wellbeing. Call in to the Health Hub office for a confidential chat.

Chantel White is our school's Mental Health Practitioner. For referrals to Chantel, students can talk to members of the school wellbeing team or their teacher.
